



PORTABLE SANITATION ASSOCIATION INTERNATIONAL'S POLICY ON ENGAGEMENT WITH THE GLOBAL PORTABLE SANITATION INDUSTRY

It is the policy of the PSAl to encourage groups of members in countries outside the United States to form nation-specific or market-specific work groups for the purpose of assisting the PSAl in understanding local needs and supporting members' efforts to extend the PSAl mission in those places. The following guidelines will apply to how this policy will be implemented:

- All members of the PSAl-affiliated work group must own/work for paid PSAl member companies.
- A chair who will be the official contact person and liaison with the PSAl must be named. S/he will also serve on the PSAl's International Advisory Council.
- The objectives and activities of the group must be transparent to the Executive Director and the Board of Directors for purposes of coordination and alignment with PSAl's overall strategic objectives.
- The PSAl staff will support the group to the extent that it supports all PSAl committees, provided the objectives of the group have been reviewed and approved by the Board.
- The group may use the PSAl name/logo – and represent their activities/work products as being on behalf of the PSAl – when given leave in writing to do so following review by the Executive Director or Board as appropriate. Absent this permission, the activities of the group are not PSAl activities and may not be represented as such.

While the global situation is constantly evolving, so is the PSAl. We expect this approach will suit the organization well for the foreseeable future, and it will assist us in staying on top of things that may be emerging in key markets. If and when our policy needs to be adjusted in light of changing circumstances, we will do that.

All international PSAl members are invited to participate in the PSAl's international advisory council. The PSAl expects to hold a meeting of the council at the Annual Convention and Trade Show each year. The Board of Directors hopes to see our international members there.
